HOW DOES THE COOPERATIVE PROGRAM WORK?

When **you give** to your local church, dollars are dispersed according to church's budget plan — part of which may include investing in missions and ministry through the **Cooperative Program (CP).**

Your church sends its CP contribution to the **South Carolina Baptist Convention (SCBC)**, where a portion of the funds are delineated to SCBC specific missions, ministries, and programs, including the South Carolina Baptist universities, while the remaining portion is forwarded on to the **Southern Baptist Convention (SBC)**. **The SBC** distributes Cooperative Program funds for missions and ministry causes of the International Mission Board, North American Mission Board, theological seminaries, and more, to mobilize resources that bear witness across North America and to the ends of the earth.

The pages of this program showcase some of the ways your CP dollars are at work saturating our state, nation, and world with the hope of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Thank you for your participation in the Cooperative Program.

In 1924, Calvary Baptist Church was organized in Lancaster to bring the families of textile mill employees to Jesus. With a booming textile industry, the church became the center of religious life for the mill community and quickly grew to capacity as programs flourished.

In time, like so many mill towns across South Carolina, looms came to a halt and employees sought work elsewhere, leaving a street of houses for sale and a stillness in activity. The church declined in number, and people were not coming to Jesus as in former days. However, the faithful members continued to gather, hoping God would restore their congregation to new life.

On Sunday, June 28 2020, Pastor Jimmy Fox led the church with a stirring exposition of Luke 5:17-25, recounting how several men sought the best way to bring a paralytic to Jesus. Pastor Jimmy stated, "Their problem wasn't believing Jesus could heal. Their problem wasn't their willingness to help the man. Their problem was finding a way to get him to Jesus." Calvary Baptist had the same problem as the men in Luke 5. How could they bring people to Jesus though they were few in number and the barriers seemed insurmountable?

At the conclusion of worship, the remaining 17 members voted to form a partnership with Second Baptist Church and add a Spanish service to the existing schedule at Calvary. Second Baptist would provide leadership, resources, and whatever else was needed to shepherd the flock at Calvary, and they would continue worship in English as while preparing to move their Spanish ministry to the Calvary location. The result would be one church body, worshipping in two languages with a vision to be "a place of lasting relationships where people love God, love people, and live the mission."
