PRACTICAL TIPS

- 1. People relate to people. Capture faces, especially smiling faces.
- 2. Observe the room and know what is around you.
- 3. Wait for a candid moment, they are always the best.
- 4. Arrive early so that you can get volunteer/prayer meetings.
- 5. Grab a few friends and ask if you can get a quick shot.

DO'S AND DONT'S

- Make sure that your camera batteries are charged.
- Have your shutter mode set to 'silent'.
- If you don't have a professional camera use your smart phone. Clean your lens and look for good lighting.
- Wear all black/dark colors.
- Don't use flash during services.
- No specific shots of offering buckets or note taking
- Do not shoot children unless you have permission.
