## Receiving SCBaptist's Adoption Grant

Kim and Matt were the first recipients of SCBaptist's Adoption Grant, made available to South Carolina Baptists to help reduce barriers for church members to care for vulnerable children. The SCBaptist Adoption Grant is made available to SCBaptists through their local church who are adopting children out of Foster Care in South Carolina.

"These funds aren't the only answer, but our prayer is that this will launch a movement of South Carolina Baptists into this worthy and pressing opportunity that is so close to the heart of God," Tony Wolfe, SCBaptist Executive Director-Treasurer, said.

Currently, three families have received the grant, and four more are in the process.
